WHEREAS, An accomplished attorney and law professor, Frank M. Covey, Jr. was the loving and devoted husband of Patricia; and

WHEREAS, Frank M. Covey, Jr. was the much-adored father of Geralyn, F. Michael, III, and Regis and the grandfather of six to whom he imparted many of the fine and noble qualities which he possessed in abundance; and

WHEREAS, After graduating from Loyola University Law School, Frank M. Covey, Jr. clerked for Illinois Appellate Court Justice U.S. Schwartz; and

WHEREAS, Frank M. Covey, Jr. practiced for twenty-eight years with the firm of McDermott, Will & Emery, and was a leader within the Chicago, Illinois State, and American Bar Associations; and

WHEREAS, Frank M. Covey, Jr. served as a senior fellow of the Center for Public Resources in New York City and was a task force leader on alternative dispute resolution mechanisms which is a division of the Special Commission of the Administration of Justice in Cook County; and

WHEREAS, Frank M. Covey, Jr. was a member of the Board of Trustees of Loyola University, President of Loyola's Alumni Association and a member of the Union League Club of Chicago; and

WHEREAS, To his beloved family, Frank M. Covey, Jr. imparts a legacy of faithfulness, service and dignity; now, therefore
