Amendment of Section 17-15-0504 of Municipal Code regarding alterations of nonconforming signs or sign structures Committee on Zoning, Landmarks and Building Standards

ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Section 17-15-0504 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, The Chicago Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended by inserting the language underscored and deleting the language stricken through as follows:

17-15-0504 Alterations.

17-15-0504-A Alterations – Permitted. Change of copy or the substitution of panels or faces on *nonconforming signs* is permitted without affecting the legal status of a sign as a nonconforming sign (subject to requirements for building and electrical permits). No other alterations are allowed, except for routine maintenance and repair, except as permitted under subsection 17-15-0504B.

17-15-0504-B Alterations – Special Use. Other alterations, including but not limited to, the replacement or reconstruction of nonconforming signs or sign structures shall be permitted if approved as a *special use*.

Nonconforming signs or sign structures may be replaced, reconstructed or otherwise altered so long as the alteration does not increase the extent of the existing nonconformity.

An application for a special use must be filed with the Zoning Board of Appeals within 12 months of a nonconforming sign or sign structure's removal from a subject property.

The intent of this subsection 17-15-0504B is to allow a property owner to 3. lawfully alter a sign or sign structure that has been made nonconforming by zoning map changes (rezonings) or amendments to the Zoning Ordinance text that occurred after the sign was lawfully established.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication.
