



WHEREAS, triclosan is found in a wide range of consumer products, including soaps, kitchen cutting boards, and toothpaste; and

WHEREAS, the National Academy of Sciences has opined that triclosan is of concern to both human and environmental health; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Chicago hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to prohibit the sale of products containing triclosan in the City; NOW THEREFORE

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:**

SECTION 1. The above recitals are expressly incorporated herein and made part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. Chapter 7-28 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by inserting a new Section 7-28-638 as follows:

**7-28-638 Triclosan - Prohibition on Sale.**

a) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, offer or expose for sale, give or furnish any product containing triclosan within the City of Chicago.

b) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, products used at hospitals, as that term is defined in the Hospital Licensing Act, 210 ILCS 85/1 et seq., shall not be subject to the limitations set forth herein.

c) Any person violating this section shall be fined not less than \$100.00 nor more than \$300.00 for the first offense, and not less than \$300.00 nor more than \$500.00 for the second and each subsequent offense. Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage and publication.
