**WHEREAS**, A resident of River Forest, Victor J. Cacciatore, Sr., was a prominent business magnate and the loving and devoted husband for fifty-seven years of Charlotte, nee Kwasigroch; and


**WHEREAS**, The entrepreneurial spirit and generosity of Victor J. Cacciatore, Sr., serve as an example to all; and
