**WHEREAS**, After a fifty-five year ministry with the Archdiocese of Chicago, Reverend Daniel Mallette has announced his retirement; and

**WHEREAS**, The Chicago City Council has been informed of this announcement by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

**WHEREAS**, The Reverend Daniel Mallette served with great holiness and dedication as the Pastor of St. Margaret of Scotland Church, 9837 South Throop Street in Chicago, for thirty-five years; and

**WHEREAS**, A friend and mentor to his parishioners, the Reverend Daniel Mallette dedicated his ministry to battling violence and poverty in his community; and

**WHEREAS**, The Reverend Daniel Mallette marched with Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. during the civil rights movement and made St. Margaret of Scotland one of the most ethnically diverse parishes in Chicago; and


**WHEREAS**, In addition to celebrating Mass at St. Margaret of Scotland The Reverend Daniel Mallette is actively involved in after school programs meant to keep youngsters off the streets; and

**WHEREAS**, After surviving a brutal attack in early 2012, the Reverend Daniel Mallette acted as an example to his Christian congregation by expressing compassion for those who did him harm; and

**WHEREAS**, In his retirement, Reverend Daniel Mallette will continue to reside at St. Margaret of Scotland, saying certain Masses and visiting parishioners, particularly those who are ill; now, therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED**, That we, the Mayor and the members of the Chicago City Council, assembled this sixth day of June, 2012, do hereby congratulate Reverend Daniel Mallette on his retirement and do hereby express our gratitude for his fifty-five years of ministry in the City of Chicago; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Reverend Daniel Mallette.
