## **A Resolution Honoring Emmanuel Whitley Simmons**

WHEREAS, Emmanuel Whitley Simmons was born in Marion Arkansas on April 24th, 1910; and

WHEREAS, Although his birth name was "Buddy", his named was later changed to Emmanuel, the given name of Christ, after it was chosen from the Bible; and

WHEREAS, In 1935, Mr. Simmons traveled from Memphis to Chicago on the Old Illinois Central Train and purchased his first home at 4707 S. Calumet Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Simmons attended Liberty Baptist Church at 4320 South Wabash and has attended Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church since 1957 where he still serves as a trustee; and

WHEREAS, In 2002, Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church dedicated a hall in Emmanuel Whitley Simmon's name to honor his many years of service; and

WHEREAS, In 1939, Mr. Simmons married his wife Flora Mae Murphy and lived with her in a house they purchased at 4410 South Vincennes; and

WHEREAS, Emmanuel Whitely Simmons has five children, 10 grandchildren, 28 great grandchildren, and three great, great grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, From 1943 to 1976, Mr. Simmons worked for the VA Hospital in Hines, IL. and at the Westside VA Hospital in Chicago and then worked as a janitor at DuSable High School before retiring in 1979; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Simmons has served on many committees and organizations including participating in the National Reparations Convention film "Paradox of Freedom"; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Simmons enjoys poetry, singing, gardening, and spending time with is grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Simmons attributes his long life to the fact that he never smoked or drank, but primarily because of his deep faith in God; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Simmons lived his life by the Bible, particularly Hebrews 11:1, which speaks of the confidence and assurance of faith; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That we the Mayor and the City Council members of the City of Chicago assembled here this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2011, do hereby commemorate Emmanuel Whitley Simmons for his life of faith and service, and
