**ORDINANCE**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:**

**SECTION 1.** The City Council finds that the areas described in Section 2 and Section 3 of this ordinance are adversely affected by the over-concentration of businesses licensed to sell alcoholic liquor within and near the areas.

**SECTION 2.** Section 4-60-023 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by deleting the language struck through, as follows:

**4-60-023      Restrictions on additional package goods licenses.**

Subject to the provisions of subsection 4-60-021(c), no additional package goods license shall be issued for any premises located within the following areas:

(41.1)            On ~~the southwest side of~~ North Northwest Highway, from North Harlem Avenue to North Sayre Avenue.

**SECTION 3.** Section 4-60-023 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by inserting the underscored language as a new subsection 4-60-023 (41.8), as follows:

**4-60-023      Restrictions on additional package goods licenses.**


Subject to the provisions of subsection 4-60-021(c), no additional package goods license shall be issued for any premises located within the following areas:

*(Omitted text is unaffected by this ordinance)*

(41.8)            On North Sayre Avenue, from North Northwest Highway to North Nordica Avenue, continuing onto North Nordica Avenue, from North Sayre Avenue to West Imlay Street.

*(Omitted text is unaffected by this ordinance)*

**SECTION 4.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.
