**WHEREAS**, David M. Hartigan has been called to eternal life by the wisdom of God at the age of 82; and

**WHEREAS**, The Chicago City Council has been informed of his passing by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

**WHEREAS**, David is survived by Kathleen Barrett, and together they were parents of a wonderful family that brought them great joy and pride, five children Rachel Dewey (Chauncey), David L. Hartigan, Peter Hartigan (Vanessa), Alexander Hartigan, Andrew Hartigan (Aimee) and eleven grandchildren Chauncey III, Oliver, Catherine D., David M. II, Margaret, Rohan, Madeline, Alexander II, Michael, Luke, and Catherine H; and

**WHEREAS**, Born and raised in Rogers Park, David graduated from Hardey Prep and Loyola Academy; and

**WHEREAS**, He is a graduate of Georgetown University where he majored in History, a passion that continued throughout his life, and also graduated with a Juris Doctor from Loyola University Law School; and

**WHEREAS**, After graduating from Loyola, David joined the U.S. Securities & Exchange Commission as a trial lawyer investigating securities fraud until his appointment to the United States Attorney's Office; and

**WHEREAS**, As Assistant U.S. Attorney, Northern District of Illinois, David served as the Chief of the Tax Division, Deputy Chief of the Civil Division and litigator in the Criminal Division. He uniquely served on a bi-partisan basis under four U.S. Attorneys Bauer, Hanrahan, Foran and Thompson; and

**WHEREAS**, David was a founding partner of Hartigan & Ward. Later, he became a Partner at Wilson & Mcilvaine and Altheimer & Gray; and


