BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

Section 1. Pursuant to Section 2-8-040 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, which allows erection of honorary street name designations, the Commissioner of the Chicago Department of Transportation shall take the necessary action for standardization of 57th to 59th S. Elizabeth Street as Honorary "Mother Betty Price Lane."

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication.

Mother Price's sudden passing has caused a great sadness to the 16th Ward and the entire Englewood community. She was a faithful leader, steadfast in the truth of the word of God, and love to her community, church, family and friends. She knew the true meaning of stewardship and never counted the cost of loyalty.

Born Betty J. Genous, Mother Price's childhood and early educational roots derive in Yazoo County, Mississippi where she learned the true meaning of service. Through her educational and spiritual upbringing, she garnished a passion in the field of social services as a social worker. After completing her education, Mother Price married Earnest Price. In their union of 52 years came two daughters Shelia and Chanquata Price.

As a child, Mother Price confessed that she was often time hungry. She made a promise to God that everyone around her would always have the food needed to eat and warm clothes to wear. With unwavering commitment to this promise, in 1997 she quit her social work job after 23 year of service, and acquired an old meat packing facility located at 1234 W. 59th St. Mother Price renovated the building, moving her mission from her home to a solid foundation in the heart of the Englewood community. This passion and commitment to service lead to the founding of "Feed, Clothe & Help the Needy Mission" (FCHN).
