WHEREAS, Raymond F. LeFevour has been called to eternal life by the wisdom of God at the age of eighty-one; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago City Council has been informed of his passing by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

WHEREAS, A longtime resident of Oak Park, Raymond F. LeFevour was a widely admired educator and the loving husband for forty-nine years of Dee; and

WHEREAS, Raymond F. LeFevour was the much-adored father of Cara, Maura, Edward, Ray, Deirdre, John and Liam, and the grandfather of sixteen to whom he imparted many of the fine and noble qualities that he possessed in abundance; and

WHEREAS, The favorite phrase of Raymond F. LeFevour was "Family comes first and there is no second"; and

WHEREAS, Raised on the West Side of Chicago, Raymond F. LeFevour graduated from DePaul University and was a United States Army paratrooper during the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, Raymond F. LeFevour enjoyed a highly successful career as a teacher and school administrator; and

WHEREAS, Raymond F. LeFevour served for thirteen years as the President of Wilbur Wright Junior College where he established high expectations for academic excellence and oversaw the construction of its new northwest side campus; and


WHEREAS, Raymond F. LeFevour retired from the Chicago City Colleges in 2000; and
