BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Section 7-38-117 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by deleting the language struck through and by inserting the language underscored, as follows:

7-38-117 Mobile food vehicle stands program.

(i) The commissioner of transportation is authorized to establish a mobile food vehicle stand within the side of the block where each of the following addresses is located:

(20) ~~426~~ 140 South Clark Street, provided that the mobile food vehicle stand at this location shall not be more than 40 feet in length;



(34) 105 East Monroe Street, provided that the mobile food vehicle stand at this location shall not be more than 40 feet in length; and

(35) 300 South Wabash Avenue, provided that the mobile food vehicle stand at this location shall not be more than 40 feet in length; and

(36) 145 South Franklin Street, provided that the mobile food vehicle stand at this location shall not be more than 40 feet in length.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.
