SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to establish and/or amend Speed Limitations at the below listed locations:

WARD	MISCELLEANEOUS:
10	South Torrence Avenue from East 106 <sup>th</sup> Street to East 130 <sup>th</sup> Street, Amend Ordinance passed 6/16/1994, On Journal page 52082; Speed Limitations, which reads: South Torrence Avenue from East 106 <sup>th</sup> Street to East 130 <sup>th</sup> Street 40 Miles Per Hour, by Striking 40 Miles Per Hour, and inserting 30 Miles Per Hour in lieu thereof; [O2020-2]
10	South Torrence Avenue from East 106 <sup>th</sup> Street to East 110 <sup>th</sup> Street, Amend Ordinance passed 6/16/1994, On Journal page 52082; Speed Limitations, which reads: South Torrence Avenue from East 106 <sup>th</sup> Street to East 110 <sup>th</sup> Street, 35 Miles Per Hour, by Striking 35 Miles Per Hour, and inserting 30 Miles Per Hour in lieu thereof; [O2020-3]
