WHEREAS, The Chicago City Council has been informed of his passing by the Honorable Patrick D. Thompson, Alderman of the 11th Ward; and

WHEREAS, Born in Chicago to Felix B. and Veronica Gorski Krydyski on October 13, 1936, Daniel was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary of Perpetual Help Church in Chicago; He was raised in the Bridgeport neighborhood of Chicago and was a 1955 graduate of De La Salle Institute; and

WHEREAS, Daniel was an honorably discharged veteran of the U.S. Army, serving 16 months as a medic with the 1st Cavalry in Korea; and

WHEREAS, Daniel and Marlene Knappe were married January 10, 1959, at St. Mary of Perpetual Help Church, three children were born to their union; Daniel and Marlene had been married 37 years when Marlene passed away February 29, 1996; and

WHEREAS, Daniel was employed in customer service with the former Harris Composition and the former District National Bank, retiring in 1998; He was active in the Holy Name Society and served nearly 30 years as Scoutmaster of the former Troop 421, earning the Silver Beaver Award; and


