Whereas The Members of this Chamber were deeply saddened to learn of the untimely passing of Chicago Police Officer Paul Winston Nauden (Star # 10803) in the line of duty on Friday, May 20, 2011 at age 46; and

WHEREAS Officer Nauden was born on December 5, 1964 at St. Joseph Hospital in Chicago to Lawrence and Barbara Nauden; and

WHEREAS Officer Nauden attended Martha Ruggles Elementary School and Chicago Vocational High School. Possessed of significant athletic skill, he played defensive end on the varsity football team; and

WHEREAS As a step towards fulfilling his lifelong dream of becoming a police officer, Officer Nauden attended Southern Illinois University, where he majored in criminal justice; and

WHEREAS In 2001 Officer Nauden met the woman who would become his wife, April Dione Manuel, at St. Paul Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, and in 2003 they were married. The happy couple became the proud parents of two daughters, Avril Alexandria and Alana Victoria. Officer Nauden's daughters, true "daddy's girls," were the light of his life; and

WHEREAS Most recently, Officer Nauden was assigned to the Roman Square facility as a member of the Narcotics Investigation Unit; and

WHEREAS Officer Nauden was a decorated 21-year veteran with the Chicago Police Department. He received numerous commendations and awards for his service, including a Police Officer of the Month Award, 2 Department Commendations, a Problem Solving Award, 18 Honorable Mentions, the Democratic Convention Service Award, a Crime Reduction Award and 3 Complimentary Letters; and

WHEREAS, Officer Nauden was especially proud of the Special Commendation he received while serving on the Alternative Lifestyle Homicide-Sex Task Force on May 5, 2001, and

WHEREAS, Officer Nauden was always willing to help out his family and could be depended upon in every situation. He was a husband, father, brother and friend without peer, and

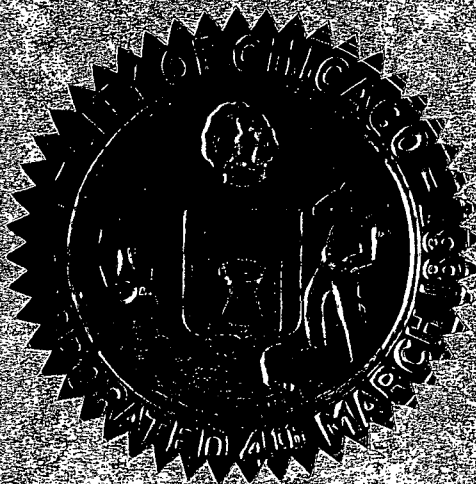
WHEREAS, Officer Nauden was preceded in death by his father, Lawrence Nauden, Sr. and his grandparents Norvell and Frances Lake, and
