Title: Call for substantive changes to policy and law in animal shelters and declaration of 2018 "The Year of the Shelter Animal"

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Chicago Animal Care & Control Commission (CACC) last year operated as the city's only open admission shelter, receiving 14,901 animals in 2017; and,

WHEREAS, 7,224 dogs were received by CACC: 3,134 dogs were received as strays, 2,235 dogs were given up by their owners, 642 were confiscated, 484 were requested for disposal, 669 were requests for euthanasia, and sixty were dogs were returned to CACC; and,

WHEREAS, 5,898 cats were received by CACC: 3,557 were received as strays, 1,815 cats were given up by their owners, 118 were confiscated, 241 were requested for disposal, 147 were requests for euthanasia, and twenty were cats returned to CACC; and,

WHEREAS, 1,551 animals were adopted to families directly from CACC, 1,406 animals were returned back to their owners, 746 were euthanized at the owner's request, 1,735 were euthanized, 195 died while in care, 1,131 were dead on arrival; and,

WHEREAS, participating Homeward Bound Program organizations have successfully transferred out of CACC 3,250 dogs, 3,951 cats, and 829 "other" animals; and,

WHEREAS, CACC has on several occasions reached maximum capacity in the shelter throughout the 2017 year and continued the trend at the beginning of 2018, proposing to euthanize animals indiscriminately in order to create space within the facilities; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That we, the Mayor and Members of the Chicago City Council, do hereby declare 2018 to be the "The Year of the Shelter Animal;" and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we commend and offer our sincerest thanks to the countless partnering organizations, volunteers and every day Chicago residents committed to improving the lives of animals & find new homes for pets throughout Chicago; and,


