WHEREAS, The Reverend Eugene J. Faucher has been called to eternal life by the wisdom of God at the age of eighty-six; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago City Council has been informed of his passing by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

WHEREAS, The Reverend Eugene J. Faucher was a widely admired member of the religious community who served for sixty-one years as a priest of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Chicago; and

WHEREAS, A native of Chicago, the Reverend Eugene J. Faucher was the son of the late Edward and Florence, nee Gorman; and

WHEREAS, The Reverend Eugene J. Faucher was ordained to the priesthood by Samuel Cardinal Stritch in 1951; and

WHEREAS, During the earlier years of his ministry, the Reverend Eugene J. Faucher served as Assistant Pastor of St. Mark Parish in Chicago and St. Colette Parish in Rolling Meadows and taught at Quigley Seminary; and


