WHEREAS, Pastor Jackson married his high school sweetheart, 1st Lady Queen Josephine, and in 1964 she gave birth to their first daughter and the family relocated to Chicago; and

WHEREAS, committed to providing for his family in their new home of Chicago, Pastor Jackson worked various jobs and secured employment in 1967 with CFS Continental, a nationwide food and coffee manufacturer and distributing company; and

WHEREAS, in 1975 Pastor Jackson accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior, and embarked on a new path for his life, joining Prayer Mission Church of God in Christ under the leadership of the late Elder Oscar Bridges.
