SECTION 1. That an ordinance by the City Council on February 9, 2005, printed on page 42285 of the Journal of Proceedings of said date establishing standing zone signs in designated area, be and the same is hereby amended by striking there from, the following:

“N. Elston Avenue (east side) from a point 302 feet north Of W. Montrose to a point 25 feet north thereof -- 15 Minute Standing Zone -- Unattended Vehicles Must Have Lights Flashing -- Tow-Away Zone After 15 Minutes -- 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. -- Monday through Saturday (04-01862457)”

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.

39	North Elston Avenue (east side) from a point 302 feet north of West Montrose Avenue, to a point 25 feet north thereof -- 15 minute standing zone -- unattended vehicles must have lights flashing -- tow-away zone after 15 minutes -- 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. -- Monday through Saturday (04-01862457);
42	East Erie Street (south side) from a point 20 feet east of North Wabash Avenue, to a point 30 feet west of North Rush Street -- no parking/tow-away zone (04-01862840).
