50	3312 West Peterson Avenue; West Peterson Avenue (north side) from a point 131 feet east of North Christiana Avenue to a point 20 feet east thereof; Reserve Parking (2% Disabled), 9:00am to 4:00pm, Monday through Friday, Public Benefit -- (16-03430180) [O2016-3000]
