## **RESOLUTION**

**WHEREAS**, The Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon has been called to eternal life by the wisdom of God at the age of eighty-seven; and

**WHEREAS**, The Chicago City Council has been informed of her passing by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

**WHEREAS**, A fifty-five year resident of River Forest, the Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon was the loving and devoted wife of the late Robert; and

**WHEREAS**, The Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon was the much-adored mother of Robert, Stephen, Daniel, David, and Jack, the grandmother of fifteen and the great-grandmother of seven; and

**WHEREAS**, The Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon ably served as a River Forest Trustee for more than twenty years which is the longest term in the history of that village; and

**WHEREAS**, An avid tennis player since the age of fourteen, the Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon attended Rollins College in Winter Park, Florida on a full athletic scholarship and was among the top-ranked tennis players in the nation; and

**WHEREAS**, After receiving her master's degree in education, the Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon taught social studies at Proviso East and West high schools, and gave tennis lessons at several area clubs and park districts during the summer months; and

**WHEREAS**, The Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon dedicated her life to the raising of her five sons, a task made challenging by the untimely death of her husband in 1956; and

**WHEREAS**, The Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon inspired the lives of countless people through her great personal goodness, charity and concern; and


**WHEREAS**, The hard work, dedication and sacrifice of the Honorable Nancy Corbett Dillon serve as an example to all; and
