WHEREAS, Archbishop Philip Hannan has been called to eternal life by the wisdom of God at the age of ninety-eight; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago City Council has been informed of his passing by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

WHEREAS, A native of Washington, D.C., Archbishop Philip Hannan was a widely admired leader in the religious community; and

WHEREAS, Named New Orleans 11th Archbishop of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of New Orleans in 1965, Archbishop Philip Hannan led the city's half million Catholics for nearly a quarter century; and

WHEREAS, Archbishop Philip Hannan will best be remembered for his service to the poor that included programs to feed the hungry and provide housing for low-income residents; and

WHEREAS, Ordained on December 8, 1939, Archbishop Philip Hannan served as a Chaplain in the U.S. Army during World War II; and

WHEREAS, A friend of the Kennedy family, Archbishop Philip Hannan delivered eulogies for both President John F. Kennedy and Senator Robert F. Kennedy, and offered prayers at the graveside service for First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis; and

WHEREAS, A theological conservative and a social liberal, Archbishop Philip Hannan lived his life according to the belief that charity is the bond of perfection; and

WHEREAS, Archbishop Philip Hannan inspired the lives of countless people through his great personal goodness, charity and concern; and


WHEREAS, The hard work, dedication and sacrifice of Archbishop Philip Hannan serve as an example to all; and
