

ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to an ordinance heretofore passed by the City Council which allows for the erection of honorary street-name signs, the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation shall take all necessary action for the standardization of W. 48th Place, south side of the street, between South Kedzie Ave. and South Whipple Street as "William K. Flood Way".

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication.

Biography



In 1970, Flood Bros Disposal Co. was incorporated and grew to 200 collection trucks in the last fifty plus years, remaining one of the last family-owned and operated waste haulers in the Chicago Metropolitan area today.

William and Carole's philanthropy extended to numerous organizations and were instrumental in Christmas Food Packing that would feed up to 4,000 families through various charities throughout the Cook, Dupage, and Kane counties. William was a Board Member of the Daughters of St. Paul and was very involved with their organization.






