WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan has been called to eternal life by the wisdom of God at the age of eighty; and

WHEREAS, The Chicago City Council has been informed of his passing by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan was the leader of a prominent Chicago legal family and the loving husband of Carol; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan was the much-adored father of the Honorable Mary Ellen, Mark, James A., Cathleen, Nancy, Barbara, Terese, Paul and Edward, the grandfather of fourteen and the greatgrandfather of three to whom he imparted many of the fine and noble qualities that he possessed in abundance; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan was the dear brother of Catherine, the Honorable Martin, Mary and the late Jack; and

WHEREAS, Born on June 3, 1932, in Chicago, James L. Coghlan was raised in St. Margaret of Scotland Parish and played football for Leo High School; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan attended Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., and transferred to DePaul University where he earned his law degree; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan joined the family firm headed by his late father, John, and began his career practicing criminal law; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan later specialized in civil law and by 1975 represented the Teamsters Union's Central States Pension Fund; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan became an expert in the emerging fields of employee benefits and Employee Retirement Income Security Act litigation; and

WHEREAS, Widely respected by his peers, James L. Coghlan served as the Chairman of the Review Board of the Illinois Attorney Registration & Disciplinary Commission from 1990 to 1994; and

WHEREAS, The hard work, sacrifice and dedication of James L. Coghlan serve as an example to all; and

WHEREAS, James L. Coghlan will be dearly missed and fondly remembered by his many relatives, friends and admirers; and

WHEREAS, To his beloved family, James L. Coghlan imparts a legacy of faithfulness, service and dignity; now, therefore
