WHEREAS, she was a member of the Chicago Roller Derby, a seasoned traveler, created objects of beauty and played the organ. Marie earned her Friendship degree in the Women's Chapter of the Loyal Order of Moose; and

WHEREAS, Marie married and divorced George Stephen, and later married Fred E. Demler, with whom she enjoyed retirement in Hometown, Illinois, until Fred's death in June 2003; and

WHEREAS, Marie was preceded in death by her loving parents, Oscar and Audrey Rhoades (nee Smith); two husbands, George Stephen and Fred E. Demler; brothers, Billy and Joseph (Betty Jean); two sisters, Luella (Louie), and Virginia (Harry); and leaves behind, to cherish her precious memories, her brothers, Sam (Rena), Wilburn (Marge), and sister Shirley (Elwood), devoted nephew, Wilburn "Skip" (Cynthia); nieces, nephews, and a host of relatives, and friends; now, therefore,
