BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, Section 160, of the Municipal Code of Chicago, the following locations are hereby designated as Loading Zones for the distances specified, during the hours specified:

WARD LOADING ZONES / STANDING ZONES:

- 27 West Washington Boulevard (north side)from a point 343ft West of North Hoyne Avenue to a point 20ft West thereof. No Parking 30 Minute Standing Zone 8:00am-8:00pm, All Days Use flashing lights tow zone. [O2021-4836] 21-04681726
- 50 West Birchwood Avenue (south side) from North Western Avenue To The First Alley West Thereof,30 Minute Standing Zone, Use Flashing Lights,5:00 PM To 3:00 AM Monday thru Friday, 11:00 AM to 3:00AM Saturday and Sunday, Tow Zone.(Public) [O2021-5414] 22-04811404 "
- 50 North Sacramento Avenue (eastside) from West Touhy Avenue to a point 45 feet thereof by striking to a point 45 feet North thereof and inserting in lieu thereof to the first alley North thereof; Amend No Parking Loading Zone [O2022-446]

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.
