***WHEREAS***, Joseph L. Curtin has been called to eternal life by the wisdom of God; and

***WHEREAS***, The Chicago City Council has been informed of his passing by Alderman Edward M. Burke; and

***WHEREAS***, A native of Chicago, Joseph L. Curtin was a widely admired member of the law enforcement community and the husband of Joan; and

***WHEREAS***, A graduate of the FBI Academy, Joseph L. Curtin enjoyed a highly successful career in public service which spanned more than four decades; and

***WHEREAS***, Joseph L. Curtin served his country in the United States Navy and joined the Chicago Police Department on January 23, 1961; and

***WHEREAS***, Joseph L. Curtin rose through the ranks to become the commanding officer of the old Area 3 Homicide Division, a highly visible role within the department; and

***WHEREAS***, Joseph L. Curtin later served as the Commander of the 25<sup>th</sup> Police District and as the Commander of the Inspection Division; and

***WHEREAS***, After retiring from the Chicago Police Department in 2001, Joseph L. Curtin became an administrator with the Illinois State Police; and

***WHEREAS***, Joseph L. Curtin was a longtime and valued member of the Irish Fellowship Club in Chicago; and


***WHEREAS***, The hard work, sacrifice and dedication of Joseph L. Curtin serve as an example to all; and
