ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that a home rule unit of government may exercise any power and perform any function relating to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, The City of Chicago, having a population in excess of Twenty-Five Thousand (25,000) is a home rule unit; and

WHEREAS, permanent districting of the Wards of the City of Chicago is a matter relating to the government and affairs of the City ; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 65ILCS 20-23/38 of the Illinois compiled Statues, the City Council shall, by ordinance, permanently district the City of Chicago on the basis of the National Census of the preceding year; and

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2-8 of the Municipal Code of the City of Chicago is hereby amended by deleting therefrom Sections 2-8-300 through 2-8-810 and substituting therefore Sections 2-8-300 through 2-8-810, as follows:

2-8-300. Wards Created--- Basis--- Permanent Boundaries.

The City is hereby divided into 50 Wards with permanent boundaries as provided in this Chapter.

In the year following the National Decennial Census, the City Council shall permanently asfix the City on the basis of such census. In the formation of the Wards in such permanent districting, as nearly as practicable, each Ward shall be compact, contiguous, and of substantially equal population with an acceptable deviation to respect established communities of interest or achieve other legally valid and permissible objectives within the current boundaries of each Ward. This provision shall be subject to Section 21-39 of the Revised Cities and Villages

Act, provided that no substitute permanent districting ordinance shall be submitted to the voters pursuant to Section 21-39 unless one-fifth or more of the Aldermen elected, who did not vote to pass the first proposed permanent districting ordinance, file with the City Clerk a substitute ordinance together with an appropriate petition signed by them and other provisions to the contrary notwithstanding.

When the Wards become permanently districted, we will no longer be confronted with redistricting. We will have equal and fair representation, and populations will be situated in the Wards they choose to live in; gerrymandering will be eliminated; each Ward will have to stand on its own; and above all else we wont have to break up any Ward for the 1992 court ruling. Currently, here are the populations per Ward, based on the last Census Count:





THIS WARD MAPPING FITS INTO THE WARD MAPPING OF MARCH 24, 1992, THIS COSTED THE CITIZENS @\$20 MILLIONS.

PERHAPS THE MOST IMPORTANT THING OF ALL; THIS INFORMATION CLEARLY POINTS OUT THESE FACTS: 1. THE PEOPLE CHOSE THE WARD THAT THEY ARE NOW IN, BECAUSE IT EMBRACED THE VIEWS, RELIGION, EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES, ETC THAT THEY THEMSELVES EMBRACED, 2.
