

COMED UTILITY AGREEMENT WITH THE CHICAGO DEPARTMENT OF AVIATION / O'HARE MODERNIZATION PROGRAM AT CHICAGO O'HARE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

THIS UTILITY AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of this day of september, 2011 ("Commencement Date"), by and between the City of Chicago, a municipal corporation and home rule unit of local government organized and existing under the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois ("City"), acting through its Chicago Department of Aviation ("CDA"), O'Hare Modernization Program ("OMP"), and Commonwealth Edison Company, an Illinois corporation ("ComEd"). The signatories to this Agreement shall be referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties".

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the City owns and operates that certain airport located within the City and commonly known as Chicago O'Hare International Airport ("Airport"); and

WHEREAS, the City has the authority to grant rights and privileges with respect to the Airport; and

WHEREAS, in an ordinance adopted by the City Council of the City of Chicago on September 1, 2004, (C.J.P. p 29893 et seq.) titled "Authorization for Execution of Agreements with Various Entities for Implementation of the O'Hare Modernization Program" (the "2004 Ordinance"), the City Council authorized the OMP Executive Director, whose authority was later merged with the Commissioner of Aviation ("Commissioner") to enter into ancillary agreements with utility companies to support the OMP; and

WHEREAS, ComEd is an electrical power transmission and distribution company that is engaged in various types of work in connection with the OMP and Airport Operations related to electricity transmission and distribution facilities. ComEd serves vital facilities at the Airport such as airfield lighting, navigational aid systems, and terminal buildings; and

WHEREAS, ComEd has performed, and will continue to perform, work on OMP Phase I and Phase 2A Projects as described in Exhibit C ("OMP Projects") attached hereto and incorporated by reference which Exhibit C may be updated from time to time during the term hereof by the Parties; and

WHEREAS, the Parties agree that an on-site staging area for ComEd's personnel who are often at the Airport conducting routine infrastructure maintenance, working on capital improvements and Airport expansion projects and the projects described on Exhibit C, and to respond to emergency power outages is of great benefit to both Parties; and

WHEREAS, ComEd currently maintains a mobile field office at the Airport which includes, among other things, a mobile office trailer, related vehicle and equipment parking and storage facilities ("Existing Field Office"); and

WHEREAS, the CDA has requested, and ComEd has agreed, subject to the fulfillment of certain terms and conditions described herein, to relocate the Existing Field Office to a new staging area location at the Airport as described and depicted in Exhibit A ("Premises") attached

hereto and incorporated by reference for the purposes described in Exhibit B ("Permitted Uses"), attached hereto and incorporated by reference; and

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the use of the Premises, prompt removal and relocation of the Existing Field Office, continued cooperation between the Parties to complete OMP projects, and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained and other valuable consideration, the Parties hereto covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals.</u> The above recitals are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 2. <u>Coordination of Services.</u> The City and ComEd agree to meet twice weekly or as may be required from time to time to discuss the projects, including, without limitation, the status of outstanding and on-going action items, the schedule, man power schedules as related to overhead, underground, outages and affected facilities, billing and budgets for existing and future work as listed in Exhibit C. All such work will be coordinated with ComEd and monitored by the CDA construction manager in the field.
- 3. <u>Development of Projects.</u> From time to time during the term hereof, the City and ComEd will meet with designers, refine Project scopes of services, schedules and develop detailed pricing estimates for remaining Phase 1 and Phase 2A Projects.
- 4. Approvals. The CDA Commissioner will approve any Notice to Proceed, final budgets and invoices for work completed or to be completed.
- 5. Premises. The CDA will provide ComEd with the Premises as described in Exhibit A for its on-Airport trailers and a separate area for equipment and materials storage all as set forth on Exhibit A. ComEd will be responsible for the installation of and payment for any and all utilities it may require for the use of the Premises, the cost of any signage, structure erection/installation on the Premises, and permitting costs, if any, with respect to the construction and installation of the Premises for ComEd's use. The City will maintain access roads to ensure that ComEd can access and use the Premises. ComEd, its contractors and their invitees must at all times comply with all laws governing their activities, the provisions of this Agreement, and the directions of the Commissioner regarding access to the Premises.
- Completion of Phase 2A, warranty expiration in 2016 ("Expiration Date"), ComEd may enter upon the Premises, or any portion thereof, in order to conduct the Permitted Uses. This Agreement may be renewed for additional periods if both Parties consent to such a renewal and Phase 2B is approved by the signatory Airlines to the Terminal Use Agreement. If the City determines that it will not renew this Agreement, the City must give ComEd at least 180 days written notice prior to the Expiration Date that it does not intend to renew this Agreement. ComEd must give at least 90 days written notice of its intent to vacate the Premises. The Parties may extend the term of this Agreement by written consent via letter; any such extension period will be governed by the same terms and conditions herein.

- 7. <u>ComEd Invoices.</u> ComEd shall submit invoices in accordance with the contracts that are applicable to each of the projects described on Exhibit C from time to time. All such invoices must be approved in accordance with the contracts entered into relating to the Projects.
- 8. Parties' Respective Obligations Regarding Relocation and the new Premises. The relocation of the Existing Field Office must be completed within 30 calendar days after the completion of CDA's site preparation and drainage work required to make the Premises ready for ComEd's use. The work needed to complete the site preparation is currently included in the Taxiway WK and North West Enabling Projects and construction began in the spring of 2011. Upon receipt of written notice from the City specifying that the City's work has been completed, ComEd must begin its relocation activities.
- 9. Easements. The City hereby reserves the rights and such easements as may be necessary to enter onto the Premises for the purpose of conducting any operations related to the function of the Airport, to verify the ComEd's compliance with this Agreement, and to inspect or conduct testing on any part of the Premises. The City agrees to use reasonable efforts not to unreasonably interfere with ComEd's use of the Premises for Permitted Uses and will provide 24 hours notice of any necessary entry, except in the case of an emergency.
- 10. Non-transferable, non-assignable. The right to enter the Premises for the Permitted Uses is non-transferable; any attempted transfer or assignment is void and without effect as to the City. ComEd acknowledges and agrees that it does not acquire and will not claim at any time any real property interest or estate of any kind or extent whatsoever, in the Premises by virtue of this Agreement or through ComEd's activities on the Premises.
- T1. <u>Utilities.</u> ComEd shall be responsible for payment of all actual costs of water, electricity, natural gas, telephone service, and all other utility services for the Premises, whether furnished by the City or purchased by the City on behalf of ComEd, or furnished to ComEd by third parties.
- 12. Access to Other Airport Property. Subject to rules and regulations governing the conduct and operations of the Airport promulgated by the Commissioner from time to time ("Airport Rules and Regulations"), ComEd will have the right and privilege of access to other Airport property for purposes: (i) of ingress to and egress from the Premises for it and its invitees and their respective equipment, vehicles, machinery and (ii) of providing transportation of its employees to, from, and within the Premises. In no event may ComEd block or otherwise obstruct a runway, taxiway, or service road with aircraft or ground vehicles, respectively, at any time or in any manner which will impair or adversely affect the use or operation of said taxiway or service road areas by City or other Airport users. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, ComEd shall have the right and privilege of access to the Airport property as permitted under that certain Commonwealth Edison Company Schedule of Rates for Electric Service filed with the Illinois Commerce Commission and issued pursuant to an Illinois Commerce Commission Order in place form time to time during the term of this Agreement (the "Tariff"), the Illinois Public Utility Act (220 ILCS 5 et seq.) as such act may be amended from time to time during the term of this Agreement, and any other applicable law or regulation.
- 13. <u>Maintenance and Repair.</u> ComEd is responsible for and must perform or cause to be performed all maintenance and repair of the Premises. ComEd is responsible for and must pay for any and all charges incurred in connection with its operations. In connection therewith, ComEd must at all times:

- a. Keep the Premises and any fixtures, equipment and personal property located thereon in a clean, safe, and orderly condition and appearance and free from debris:
- Maintain the same in as good or better condition (reasonable wear and tear excepted) as existed on the Commencement Date and perform all ordinary repairs, replacements, and painting;
- c. Control all of its vehicular traffic on the Airport and take all precautions reasonably necessary to promote the safety of its invitees and other persons, and employ such means as may be necessary to safely direct the movements of its vehicular traffic;
- d. Either directly or through a licensed independent contractor, dispose of its garbage, debris, and other waste materials at properly permitted facilities and undertake a routine pest control program for the Premises.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, in no event shall ComEd be obligated to maintain, repair, or replace any of the utilities installed at the Airport for use at the Premises or elsewhere to the extent such utilities are located (1) outside the Premises or (2) within rights-of-way or other access roads and ComEd be obligated to incur, or reimburse the City for, any of the costs or expenses associated with the maintenance, repair, or replacement of such utilities.

- 14. Modifications to Premises. With prior notice to and approval from the Commissioner, ComEd may from time to time install certain installations and improvements and modify or expand existing installations within the Premises ("Premises Alterations"). ComEd understands and agrees that, upon completion, (except for any mobile trailers that may be from time to time located on or affixed to the Premises), any Premises Alterations shall become property of the City and that City shall have no obligation to compensate ComEd for the Premises Alterations. Before entering into any contract for any Premises Alterations, ComEd shall submit a construction application with complete plans and specifications for the proposed work to the Commissioner for prior written approval. The Commissioner may request that the contractor provide performance and payment bonds in a form acceptable to the Commissioner in accordance with City laws and policies.
 - a. ComEd shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the City, its officers, agents, and employees against losses occasioned by death, injury to persons, or damage to property, arising out of or in connection with the performance of construction work, against the risk of loss or damage to the construction prior to the completion of any Premises Alterations, and against losses resulting from claims and demands by third parties arising out of the performance of the Premises Alterations. ComEd shall provide or shall require its contractor to provide, liability insurance covering the foregoing, and naming the City as an additional insured in accordance with the terms of Exhibit D. ComEd shall also include in any construction contract such provisions as may be reasonably required by the Commissioner relating to the operation of the contractor at the Airport.
 - b. All work performed by ComEd or its contractor, including workmanship and materials shall be performed in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by the Commissioner. Such work may be inspected by the Commissioner, or the authorized representative of the Commissioner, at any time. However, the City is not obligated to conduct such inspections.
 - c. ComEd shall deliver to the Commissioner "as built" drawings reflecting any construction and/or modifications to the Premises and shall keep such drawings

- current throughout the term of this Agreement. [PLEASE NOTE, COMED IS WILLING TO PROVIDE THE AS-BUILT PLANS BUT THESE CANNOT BE PROVIDED UNTIL COMED RECEIVES THE AIRPORT AS BUILT PLANS FOR THIS AREA OF THE AIRPORT SO THAT THEY CAN BE PREPARED.]
- d. ComEd shall discharge when due all obligations to contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, workmen, suppliers, and others for all work performed and for all materials furnished for or on account of ComEd.
- 15. <u>Liens Prohibited.</u> ComEd must keep the Premises free and clear of any and all liens in any way arising out of the modification, improvement, operation, maintenance or use thereof by ComEd; provided, however, ComEd may in good faith contest the validity of any lien, provided such contest does not impair the City's rights with respect to the Premises. City's rights to the Premises and the Airport are and always shall be paramount to the interests of ComEd therein. Nothing in this Agreement empowers ComEd to commit or engage in any act which can, shall, or may encumber the rights of City. In no event shall this Agreement or any rights or privileges hereunder be an asset of ComEd under any bankruptcy, insolvency, or reorganization proceedings.
- **16.** <u>Insurance</u>. ComEd must comply with the insurance requirements set forth in Exhibit D, attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

17. Indemnity and Release.

- (a) Except to the extent set forth in the Tariff and to the maximum extent permitted under applicable law, ComEd must indemnify, keep and hold harmless the City, its officers, representatives, elected and appointed officials, agents and employees from and against any and all Losses, including but not limited to those related to:
 - (i) injury, death or damage of or to any person or property;
 - (ii) any infringement or violation of any property right (including any patent, trademark or copyright); and
 - (iii) the City's exercise of its rights and remedies under this Agreement
 - (iv) injuries to or death of any employee of ComEd or any subcontractor under any workers compensation statute; and

"Losses" means, individually and collectively, liabilities of every kind, including losses, damages and reasonable costs, payments and expenses (such as, but not limited to, court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements), claims, demands, actions, suits, proceedings, judgments or settlements, any or all of which in any way arise out of or relate to ComEd's activities under and pursuant to this Agreement, except for such liabilities shown by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction to have been caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the City, its officers, representatives, elected and appointed officials, and employees and except for such liabilities as are governed by the Tariff.

(b.) To the extent permissible by law, ComEd waives any limits to the amount of its obligations to indemnify or contribute to any sums due under any Losses, including any claim by any employee of ComEd that may be subject to the Workers Compensation Act, 820 ILCS 305/1 et seq. or any other related law or judicial decision (such as, Kotecki v. Cyclops Welding Corporation, 146 Ill. 2d 155 (1991)). The City, however, does not waive any limitations it may

have on its liability under the Illinois Workers Compensation Act, the Illinois Pension Code, any other statute or judicial decision.

- (c) ComEd, on behalf of itself, its invitees and any and all parties who enter onto the Premises at ComEd's direction (collectively, "Releasers"), do hereby release, acquit and forever discharge City, its officials, agents and employees, of and from any and all known and unknown causes of action, damages, liabilities, costs, expenses and claims and demands of whatsoever kind or nature which Releasers now have or which may accrue against City, its officials, agents and employees on account of any and all known and unknown present or future injuries, Losses and damages sustained or received or which may be sustained by Releasers or the property of Releasers occurring on, at or about the Premise, except if such injuries, Losses or damages are as a result of the City's obligations under this Agreement or are shown by final judgment by a court of competent jurisdiction to have been caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the City, its officials, and employees. ComEd is responsible for notifying other Releasers of this provision and obtaining their written release.
- (d) ComEd acknowledges that the requirements set forth in this section to indemnify, keep and save harmless, defend upon demand, and release the City are apart from and not limited by the ComEd's duties under this Agreement. This indemnification provision shall survive the expiration of the Agreement (or subsequent extension) or earlier termination of this Agreement.
- 18. Confidentiality. Except as required by law, ComEd shall not issue publicity news releases, grant press interviews, or disseminate any information regarding the Premises or its intentions therewith without the prior written consent of the Commissioner. In the event that ComEd is presented with a request for documents by any administrative agency or with a subpoena duces tecum regarding any records, data, or documents which may be in ComEd's possession by reason of this Agreement, ComEd shall, to the extent permissible by law and to the extent not prohibited by the terms of such subpoena, immediately give notice to the City and to the Corporation Counsel of the City, with the understanding that the City shall have the opportunity to contest such process by any means available to it before such records or documents are submitted to a court or other third party, provided, however, that ComEd shall not be obligated to withhold such delivery beyond that time as may be requested by a court, any governmental agency, or administrative agency of competent jurisdiction, unless the subpoena or request is quashed or the time to produce is otherwise extended.
- 19. Compliance with all Laws. ComEd, at its sole expense, must obtain all necessary permits and authority from governmental entities and agencies and comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations with respect to any entry onto the Premises and conducting any business thereon or performing work thereon, including but not limited to those laws enumnerated in Exhibit E, attached hereto and incorporated by reference.
- 20. Compliance with Airport Security Laws. This Agreement is expressly subject to 49 U.S.C. 44901 et seq., as amended from time to time, the provisions of which are hereby incorporated by reference, and all rules and regulations promulgated thereunder. ComEd shall, notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, at no additional cost to City, perform under this Agreement and in compliance with those guidelines developed by City, the TSA, and the FAA with the objective of maximum security enhancement.

ComEd shall observe and obey all rules and regulations governing the conduct and operation of the Airport promulgated from time to time by City, County, state or federal authorities and, in particular, ComEd agrees at all times to comply with any master security plan and procedures for the Airport as may be established by City from time to time.

Airport Security Badges. All individuals must wear and display their Airport Security Badges on their outer apparel at all times while at the Airport, ComEd must obtain from the airport badging office Airport Security Badges for any person working at the airport on ComEd's behalf. No person will be allowed beyond security checkpoints without a valid Airport Security Badge. Each such person must submit signed and properly completed application forms to receive an Airport Security Badge. Additional forms and tests may be required to obtain Airport Driver's Licenses and Vehicle Permits. The application forms will solicit such information as the Commissioner may require in her discretion, including but not limited to name, address, date of birth (and for vehicles, driver's license and appropriate stickers). ComEd is responsible for requesting and completing the form for each person who will be working at the Airport on ComEd's behalf and all vehicles to be used on the job site. Upon signed approval of the application by the Commissioner or his designee, the employee will be required to attend a presentation regarding airport security and have his or her photo taken for the badge. The Commissioner may grant or deny the application in his/her sole discretion. ComEd must make available to the Commissioner, within one day of request, the personnel file of any person who will be working on the project.

In order for a person to have an Airport Security Badge, a criminal history record check ("CHRC") conducted by the Department of Aviation will also be required. The CHRC will typically include a fingerprint analysis by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and such other procedures as may be required by the TSA. Airport Security Badges, Vehicle Permits and Driver's Licenses will only be issued based upon properly completed application forms. Employees or vehicles without proper credentials may be removed from the secured area and may be subject to fine or arrest. Contractor will be jointly and severally liable for any fines imposed on any person working on its behalf.

- 22. <u>City's Approval</u>. Except as expressly stated otherwise, whenever City's approval, consent, or determination is required under this Agreement, the City may withhold its approval or consent in its sole discretion, and all such approvals, consents, and any determinations or directives to be made by the City will be made by the Commissioner. Nothing contained in this Agreement impairs the right of City in the exercise of its governmental functions including, without limitation. No official, employee or agent of the City will be held personally liable for any damages, expenses or costs incurred by ComEd in connection with this Agreement.
- 23. Applicable Law. This Agreement will be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois.
- **24. Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement is deemed to be unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement.
- 25. <u>Modifications and Amendments.</u> Any modifications or amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and bear the signatures of authorized representatives of the City and ComEd.

- 26. Entire Agreement. This Agreement and the Exhibits attached hereto and incorporated by reference, shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties as to the subject matter hereof and no other warranties, inducements, considerations, promises, or interpretations shall be implied or impressed upon this Agreement that are not expressly addressed herein.
- Headings. The section and paragraph headings of this Agreement are for 27. convenience only and shall not be construed as defining or limiting in any way the scope or intent of the provisions hereof.
- Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their heirs, administrators, successors and assigns, where applicable.
- [^] 29. ComEd's Authority. ComEd represents that the signatures of each person signing on its behalf is made with complete and full authority to commit it to every term and condition of this Agreement, including every representation, certification, and warranty contained herein. The City represents that the signatures of each person signing on behalf of the City is made with complete and full authority to commit the City to every term and condition of this Agreement, including every representation, certification, and warranty contained herein.
- Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same force and effect as if all signatures were appended to one document, each of which shall be deemed an original.
- Notices and Consents. All consents and approvals shall be in writing. All notices and other communications in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and be sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid and addressed as follows:

Exhibit D Insurance Requirements

Commonwealth Edison Agreement At O'Hare International Airport

ComEd must provide and maintain at ComEd's own expense, during the Agreement Term and the time period following expiration, if ComEd is required to return and perform any additional work, the insurance coverages and requirements specified below, insuring all operations related to the Agreement.

A. INSURANCE TO BE PROVIDED

1) Workers Compensation and Employers Liability

Workers Compensation Insurance, as prescribed by applicable law covering all employees who are to provide a service under this Agreement and Employers Liability coverage with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident or illness.

2) Commercial General Liability (Primary and Umbrella)

Commercial General Liability Insurance or equivalent with limits of not less than \$10,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage liability. Coverages must include the following: All premises and operations, products/completed operations, explosion collapse, underground, separation of insureds, defense, and contractual liability (not to include Endorsement CG 21 39 or equivalent). The City of Chicago is to be included as an additional insured on a primary, non-contributory basis for any liability arising directly or indirectly from the work.

3) Automobile Liability (Primary and Umbrella)

When any motor vehicles (owned, non-owned and hired) are used in connection with work to be performed, the ComEd must provide Automobile Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$10,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. The City of Chicago is to be included as an additional insured on a primary, non-contributory basis.

4) Property

ComEd is responsible for all loss or damage to City property at replacement cost that results from the Agreement.

ComEd is responsible for all loss or damage to personal property (including but not limited to material, equipment, tools and supplies) owned, rented or used by ComEd.

B. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

ComEd must furnish the Chicago Department of Aviation, 10510 West Zempke Road Chicago, Illinois 60666, original Certificates of Insurance, letters of self-insurance, or such similar evidence, to be in force on the date of this Agreement, and Renewal Certificates of Insurance, or such similar evidence, if the coverages have an expiration or renewal date occurring during the term of this Agreement. ComEd must submit evidence of insurance on the City of Chicago City Insurance

Certificate Form, letters of self-insurance, or equivalent prior to execution of Agreement. The receipt of any certificate does not constitute Agreement by the City that the insurance requirements in the Agreement have been met or that the insurance policies indicated on the certificate are in compliance with all Agreement requirements. The failure to obtain certificates or other insurance evidence from ComEd is not a waiver by the City of any requirements for ComEd to obtain and maintain the specified coverages. ComEd must advise all insurers of the Agreement provisions regarding insurance. Non-conforming insurance does not relieve ComEd of the obligation to provide insurance as specified herein. Nonfulfillment of the insurance conditions may constitute a violation of the Agreement, and the City retains the right to stop work until proper evidence of insurance is provided, or the Agreement may be terminated.

The insurance must provide for 60 days prior written notice to be given to the City in the event coverage is substantially changed, canceled, or non-renewed.

To the extent permitted by applicable law, ComEd (or its parent or affiliates, as applicable) may self-insure the insurance requirements under this Agreement.

Any deductibles or self insured retentions on referenced insurance coverages must be borne by ComEd.

ComEd hereby waives and agrees to require their insurers to waive their rights of subrogation against the City of Chicago, its employees, elected officials, agents, or representatives.

The coverages and limits furnished by ComEd in no way limit ComEd's liabilities and responsibilities specified within the Agreement or by law.

Any insurance or self insurance programs maintained by the City of Chicago do not contribute with insurance provided by ComEd under the Agreement.

The required insurance to be carried is not limited by any limitations expressed in the indemnification language in this Agreement or any limitation placed on the indemnity in this Agreement given as a matter of law.

ComEd must require all subcontractors to provide the insurance required herein, or ComEd may provide the coverages for subcontactors. All subcontractors are subject to the same insurance requirements as ComEd unless otherwise specified in this Agreement.

If ComEd or subcontractors desire additional coverages, the party desiring the additional coverages is responsible for the acquisition and cost.

Nothwistanding any provison in the Agreement to the contrary, the City of Chicago Risk Management Department maintains the right to modify, delete, aleter or change these requirements.

Exhibit E

CERTIFICATIONS

In furtherance of its obligations under that certain ComEd Utility Agreement with the Chicago Department of Aviation/O'Hare Modernization Program at Chicago O'Hare International Airport (the "Agreement") dated as of August 1/8, 2011 between the City of Chicago, a municipal corporation and home rule unit of local government organized and existing under the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois (the "City"), acting through its Chicago Department of Aviation O'Hare Modernization Program and Commonwealth Edison Company ("ComEd"), ComEd, based upon a reasonable and good faith inquiry, hereby certifies to the City:

- A. General: ComEd will at all times observe and comply, and will use commercially reasonable efforts to cause its Contractors to observe and comply, with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and executive orders, now existing or hereinafter in effect, which may in any manner affect the performance of the License. Provision(s) required by law, ordinance, rules, regulations, or executive orders to be inserted in this License will be deemed inserted, whether or not they appear in this License.
- B. Airport Rules and Regulations: ComEd will comply, and will use all reasonable efforts to cause its Contractors to comply with all rules and regulations governing the conduct and operation of the Airport, which may be promulgated from time to time by the Commissioner.

C. Non-Discrimination:

- 1. General Requirements:
 - a. ComEd, as and to the extent set forth in applicable law, understands that it will be an unlawful employment practice for ComEd to fail to hire, to refuse to hire, to discharge, or to discriminate against any individual with respect to compensation, or the terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, because of such individual's race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap, or national origin; or to limit, segregate, or classify employees or applicants for employment in any way which would deprive or tend to deprive any individual of employment opportunities or otherwise, adversely affect such individual=s status as an employee, because of such individual's race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap, or national origin.
 - b. ComEd will comply with The Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. Sec. 2000 et seq. (1981), as amended. As and to the extent applicable and required, ComEd will further comply with Executive Order No. 11,246, 30 Fed. Reg. 12,319 (1965), reprinted in 42 U.S.C. 2000(e) note, as amended by Executive Order No. 11,375 32 Fed. Reg. 14,303 (1967) and by Executive Order No. 12,086, 43 Fed. Reg. 46,501 (1978); the Age Discrimination Act, 43 U.S.C. Sec. 6101-6106 (1981); the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. Sec. 793-794 (1981); the Americans with Disabilities Act, P.L. 101-336; 41 C.F.R. part 60 et seq. (1990); Air

Carriers Access Act, 49 U.S.C.A. 1374; and, FAA Circular No. 150/5100 15A.

- State Requirements: As and to the extent applicable and required, ComEd will
 comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq. (1990), as
 amended; the Discrimination in Public Contracts Act, 775 ILCS 10/0.01 et seq.
 (1990), as amended; and the Environmental Barriers Act., 410 ILCS 25/1 et seq.
- 3. City Requirements: As and to the extent applicable and required,
 - a. ComEd will comply with the Chicago Human Rights Ordinance, Chapter
 2-160, Section 2-160-010 et seq. of the Municipal Code (1990), as amended.
 - Further, to the extent required by applicable law, ComEd will furnish such reports and information as requested by the Chicago Commission of Human Relations.
- 4. Contractors: Unless otherwise prohibited by law, ComEd agrees to use reasonable efforts to have the above provisions incorporated in principle in all agreements entered into with any suppliers of materials, providers of services, Contractors, and labor organizations which furnish skilled, unskilled and craft union skilled labor, or which may provide any such materials, labor or services in connection with this License.
- D. Non-Collusion, Bribery of a Public Officer or Employee: ComEd will comply with the Municipal Code of Chicago, Section 2-92-320, to the extent applicable and required, as follows:
- 1. ComEd, to the best of its knowledge, has not:
 - been convicted of bribery or attempting to bribe a public officer or employee of the City of Chicago, the State of Illinois, or any agency of the federal government or any state or local government in the United States, in that office's or employee's official capacity; or
 - b. been convicted of agreement or collusion among bidders or prospective bidders in restraint of freedom of competition by agreement to bid a fixed price, or otherwise; or
 - made an admission of guilt of such conduct described in (a) or (b) above which is a matter of record but has not been prosecuted for such conduct.
- 2. For purposes of this section, where an official, agent or employee of a business entity has committed any offense under this section on behalf of such an entity and pursuant to the direction or authorization of a responsible official thereof, the business entity will be chargeable with the conduct. One business entity will be chargeable with the conduct of an Affiliated agency.
- 3. Ineligibility under this section will continue for three years following such conviction or admission. The period of ineligibility may be reduced, suspended,

or waived by the Chief Procurement Officer under certain specific circumstances. Reference is made to Section 2-92-320 for a detailed description of the conditions which would permit the Chief Procurement Officer to reduce, suspend, or waive the period of ineligibility.

E. Conflict of Interest:

ComEd certifies that it, its officers, directors and employees, and the officers, directors and employees of each of its members if a joint venture, and Contractors, presently have no interest and will acquire no interest, direct or indirect, in the Agreement which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of the obligations hereunder. ComEd further certifies that in the adherence to the Agreement, no person having any such interest will be employed during the terms of this Agreement.

F. Office of Inspector General and Legislative Inspector General (Chapter 2-56 and 2-55 of the Chicago Municipal Code):

 ComEd, as and to the extent required by law, will cooperate with the Inspector General and Legislative Inspector General in any investigation or hearing undertaken pursuant to Chapter 2-56 or 2-55 of the Chicago Municipal Code. ComEd understands and will abide by all applicable provisions of Chapter 2-56 and 2-55 of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

G. Cooperation with Office of Compliance:

1. ComEd, as and to the extent required by law, will cooperate with the Office of Compliance in any investigation or audit pursuant to Chapter 2-26 of the Municipal Code of Chicago. ComEd understands and will abide by all applicable provisions of Chapter 2-26 of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

H. Governmental Ethics Ordinance (Chapter 2-156 of the Municipal Code):

- ComEd, as and to the extent applicable, will comply with Chapter 2-156 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, Governmental Ethics, including but not limited to Provision 2-156-120 pursuant to which no payment, gratuity of offer of employment will be made in connection with any City contract, by or on behalf of a Contractor to ComEd or any person associated there with, as inducement for the award of a subcontract or order.
- 2. Any contract negotiated, entered into, or performed in violation of any of the provisions of chapter 2-156 will be voidable as to the City.
- I. Section 2-92-586 of the Municipal Code of Chicago: The City encourages ComEds to use Contractors that are firms owned or operated by individuals with disabilities, as defined by section 2-92-586 of the Municipal Code of the City of Chicago, where not otherwise prohibited by federal or state law.

J. MacBride Principles Ordinance:

- The City of Chicago through the passage of the MacBride Principles Ordinance seeks to promote fair and equal employment opportunities and labor practices for religious minorities in Northern Ireland and provide a better working environment for all citizens in Northern Ireland.

ComEd must complete EDS(s) in which ComEd (and its parent entities, if applicable) identifies all persons with 7.5% or more ownership interest and in which ComEd certifies (among other things) that ComEd, its agents, employees, and officers: a) have not been engaged in or been convicted of bribery or attempted bribery of a public officer or employee of the City of Chicago, the State of Illinois, any agency of the federal government or any state or local government in the United States or engaged in or been convicted of bid-rigging or bid-rotation activities as defined in this section as required by the Illinois Criminal Code; b) do not owe any debts to the State of Illinois, in accordance with Section 65 ILCS 5/11-42.1-1 of the Illinois Municipal Code and c) are not presently debarred or suspended from public contracts.
- 2. ComEd must provide, without need for request by the City, an updated EDS(s) if there is any change in ownership or change in any other circumstance that would render the EDS(s) then currently on file inaccurate or obsolete. Failure to provide an updated EDS(s) when required is cause for cancellation of the License. In the event of a change in ownership outside of ComEd=s reasonable control (such as acquisition of controlling interest in ComEd through purchase of shares on a public exchange), the City shall have the right to cancel the License.
- L. Compliance with Child Support Orders: ComEd will comply with the Chicago Municipal Code Section 2-92-415 Compliance With Child Support Orders. For the purpose of compliance with this Section, ComEd compliance includes compliance by a Substantial Owner. A Substantial Owner means any person who, directly or indirectly, owns or holds a 10% or more interest in ComEd.
- M. Federal Ineligible Contractors: ComEd represents that neither ComEd nor any Affiliate of ComEd appears on the Specially Designated Nationals List, the Denied Persons List, the Unverified List, the Entity List, or the Debarred List as maintained by the Office of Foreign Assets Control of the U.S. Department of the Treasury or by the Bureau of Industry and Security of the U.S. Department of Commerce (or their successors), or on any other list of persons or entities with which the City may not do business under any applicable law, rule, regulation, order or judgment.

- N. Federal Legal Requirements: ComEd shall comply, and shall use all reasonable efforts to cause its Contractors to comply, with all applicable federal laws, codes, regulations, ordinances, rules, directives, assurances and orders applicable to operations at airports.
 - ComEd must comply with the notification and review requirements covered in Part 77 of the Federal Aviation Regulations if any future structure or building is planned for the Premises, or in the event of any planned modification or alteration of any present or future building or structure situated on the Premises. (FAA order 5190.6A - AGL-600)
 - Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to grant or authorize
 the granting of an exclusive right to provide aeronautical services to the
 public as prohibited by section 308(a) of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958, as
 amended, and the City reserves the right to grant to others the privilege and
 right of conducting any one or all activities of an aeronautical nature. (Federal
 Aviation Act of 1958 section 308(a) AC 150/5100-16A)

 - 4. The City reserves the right, but is not obligated to ComEd, to maintain and keep in repair the landing area of the Airport and all publicly-owned facilities of the Airport, together with the right to direct and control all activities of ComEd in this regard. (FAA order 5190.6A - AGL-600)

This Agreement is subordinate to the provisions of and requirements of any existing or future agreement between the City and the United States, relative to the development, operation, or maintenance of the Airport (FAA Order 5190.6A AGL-600), including usage by United States Government aircraft of Airport facilities developed with federal financial assistance. (Grant Assurance 27)
 - 6. This Agreement and all the provisions of this Agreement are subject to whatever right the United States Government now has or in the future may have or acquire affecting the control, operation, regulation, and taking over of the Airport, or the exclusive or non-exclusive use of the Airport by the United States during the time of war or national emergency. (Surplus Property Act of 1944 FAA Order 5190-6A AGL-600)
 - 7. It is clearly understood by ComEd that no right or privilege has been granted that would operate to prevent any person, firm, or corporation operating aircraft on the Airport from performing any services on its own aircraft with its own regular employees (including maintenance and repair) that it may choose to perform. (Assurance 22 FAA Order 5190.6A AGL-600)

The agreements and certifications of ComEd set forth herein are made by ComEd only to and for the benefit of the City of Chicago and the successors and assigns of the City of Chicago and may be relied upon by the City of Chicago. No person or entity is or shall be a third party beneficiary of the agreements or certifications of ComEd

set forth herein and may not rely on the matters set forth above. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, in no event shall any obligation, damages or other liability be charged or asserted against ComEd by reason of this certificate, it being the intent of the parties that the sole recourse or remedy of the addressees shall be to estop ComEd and its successors and assigns from asserting any matter contrary to the certifications and agreements set forth above in connection with the Agreement.
