ORDINANCE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO Acct. No. 43697 - 110 Permit No. 1105679

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO, upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to construct, install, maintain and use five (5) Irrigation System(s) under the public right-of-way adjacent to its premises known as 5736-5750 S. Woodlawn Ave..

Said Irrigation System(s) at 5750 S Woodlawn Ave measure(s):

One (1) at fifty-four (54) feet in length, and point zero eight (.08) feet in width for a total of four point three two (4.32) square feet. Piping shall be one (1) foot four (4) inches below grade level.

One (1) at fifty-four (54) feet in length, and point zero eight (.08) feet in width for a total of four point three two (4.32) square feet. Piping shall be one (1) foot four (4) inches below grade level.

Said Irrigation System(s) at 5736-5740 S Woodlawn Ave measure(s):

One (1) at seventy-eight (78) feet in length, and point zero eight (.08) feet in width for a total of six point two four (6.24) square feet. Piping shall be one (1) foot four (4) inches below grade level.

One (1) at seventy-eight (78) feet in length, and point zero eight (.08) feet in width for a total of six point two four (6.24) square feet. Piping shall be one (1) foot four (4) inches below grade level.

Said Irrigation System(s) at 5736-5750 S Woodlawn Ave measure(s):

One (1) at one hundred six (106) feet in length, and point zero eight (.08) feet in width for a total of eight point four eight (8.48) square feet. Piping shall be one (1) foot four (4) inches below grade level.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Transportation (Office of Underground Coordination) and Department of Water Management.

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1105679 herein granted the sum of two thousand (\$2,000.00) per annum in advance.


A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.
