## RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, Advocates for Chicagoland Animals has launched a campaign calling upon Chicago to become a "No-Kill City"; and

**WHEREAS**, The Chicago City Council has been informed of this campaign by Aldermen Edward M. Burke and Raymond Lopez; and

**WHEREAS,** The "no-kill" philosophy states that no healthy or treatable animal brought into a shelter should be killed for reasons of space and that euthanasia should be reserved only for those animals who are terminally ill; and

**WHEREAS**, The campaign opposes killing animals after minimal "hold" periods and seeks to expose shelters that charge "processing fees" which discourage the reunification of pets with their owners; and

**WHEREAS,** According to Advocates for Chicagoland Animals, the Chicago Department of Animal Care and Control killed more than 10,000 animals over the past two years at a cost of \$1.1 million, or nearly 11 percent of its budget; and

**WHEREAS,** Advocates for Chicagoland Animals cited an announcement by the City of Atlanta that it has recently achieved a 95 percent "save rate" since adopting "No-Kill" protocols in November of 2015; and

**WHEREAS**, "No-Kill" policies are both an humane and fiscally responsible alternative that can save local governments money while promoting an increase in pet adoptions; now, therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED,** That we, the Mayor and the members of the Chicago City Council, assembled this sixteenth day of March, 2016, do hereby encourage all Chicago animal shelters to adopt "no-kill" policies; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the Committee on Health convene hearings to examine the feasibility of converting the Chicago Department of Animal Care and Control's David R. Lee Shelter to a "No-Kill" facility.
