## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City of Chicago is the third largest city in the United States with an estimated population of roughly 2.7 million; and

WHEREAS, at the time of the 2010 U.S. Census, 32.9 percent of Chicago's overall population identified as black; and

WHEREAS, to date, the estimated black population of Chicago still constitutes roughly one-third of the city's population; and

WHEREAS, it has been found that black persons represent the majority of open missing persons cases in the City of Chicago, with approximately two-thirds of the more than 830 open missing persons cases being black; and

WHEREAS, of the 838 open missing persons cases<sup>1</sup>, 337 cases concern black youth between the ages of 11 and 21; and

WHEREAS, of the 838 open missing persons cases, black girls between the ages of 11 and 21 represented 202 cases, almost one-fourth of all cases, while white girls of the same age represent only 4% of such cases, and

WHEREAS, numerous studies show that young black women constitute a particularly vulnerable group to perpetrators of sex trafficking crimes<sup>2</sup>; and

WHEREAS, these numbers reflect a striking imbalance of instance and response to black missing persons; and

WHEREAS, Chicago continues to struggle to address racial inequities as they affect the quality of life, education, income, and employment of black Chicagoans;
