### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to install and/or amend Reserved Parking (2% Disabled) Signs at the below listed locations:

WARD	MISCELLEANEOUS:
40	North Claremont Avenue; North Claremont Avenue (east side) from a point 93 feet north of 2310 West Ainslie Street to a point 25 feet north thereof; Reserved Parking (2% Disabled), All Times, All Days (17-00098837) [O2016-8958]
40	6350 North Paulina Street; North Paulina Street (west side) from a point 20 feet north of West Highland Avenue to a point 20 feet north thereof; Reserved Parking (2% Disabled); All Times, All Days (17-00071015) [O2016-8962]
40	6348 North Ridge Boulevard; 6348 North Ridge Boulevard (west side) from a point 110 feet south of West Devon Avenue to a point 40 feet south thereof; Reserved Parking (2% Disabled), All Times, All Days (17-00098921) [O2016-8993]
