Whereas, Financial barriers keep many high-achieving, intelligent, and hard-working students from attending college; and

WHEREAS, To help overcome these barriers, the Posse Foundation and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation provide an opportunity for outstanding minority students with significant financial need to reach their highest potential through post-secondary education; and

WHEREAS, The Posse Foundation provides educational opportunities for these students, who may have been overlooked in traditional college selection processes; and

whereas, The Posse Foundation identifies, recruits and trains student leaders nominated by their high school to form multicultural teams called "Posses," consisting of 10 to 12 Posse Scholars; and

WHEREAS, Posse Scholars undergo an intensive, eight-month, pre-collegiate training program to prepare them for enrollment at prestigious colleges and universities nationwide, in a welcoming campus environment that promotes understanding, collaboration and cross-cultural communication; and

**WHEREAS**, The Posse Foundation partners with top-tier colleges and universities to provide each Posse Scholar with a four-year, full-tuition, leadership scholarship; and

**WHEREAS,** Since the Posse Foundation was established in 1989, its educational partners have awarded \$1.2 billion in scholarships to students nationwide, and \$211.7 million in scholarships to Chicago students; and

WHEREAS, Through its collaboration with CPS, this year the Posse Foundation selected 97 extraordinarily qualified Chicago Public High School students to become Posse Scholars. These students will continue to pursue excellence at twelve top-tier colleges and universities across the Country; and



WHEREAS, The Gates Scholarship is the latest effort by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to help low-income, high-achieving minority students pay for college; and

WHEREAS, The Gates Scholarship, open to high school seniors, seeks to cultivate a new generation of leaders by promoting academic excellence through college graduation, and by enabling accomplished individuals to reach their full potential; and

WHEREAS, The Gates Scholarship is awarded each year to 300 minority students, who are selected from a diverse and competitive national applicant pool, based on their academic record, leadership ability, personal success skills, and a variety of other criteria, including essays, recommendations and interviews for 600 finalists; and

**WHEREAS**, This year, five Chicago Public High School students were selected to receive The Gates Scholarship. These enormously talented students will continue to pursue excellence at top universities; and

**WHEREAS**, All of Chicago is tremendously proud of the hard work and dedication of its Posse Scholars and of this year's recipients of The Gates Scholarship. They are the future of Chicago; now, therefore
