<u>ORDINANCE</u>

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Section 9-64-170 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by deleting the language stricken through and by inserting the language underscored, as follows:

9-64-170 Parking restrictions – Special types of vehicles – Exceptions.

(a) (1) Residential streets – Restrictions. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (a), or in subsection (e) or (f)(2) of this section, it shall be unlawful for any person to park at any time, including overnight, any truck, van, tractor, truck tractor, semi-trailer, trailer, recreational vehicle more than 22 feet in length, self- contained motor home, bus, taxicab, commercial vehicle, limousine (whether for hire or not for hire) or livery vehicle on any residential street within the City.

(Omitted text is unaffected by this ordinance)

(b) (1) Business streets – Restrictions. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection (b) or in subsection(e) or (f)(2) of this section, it shall be unlawful for any person to park at any time, including overnight, any truck, truck tractor, semi-trailer, trailer, self-contained motor home, commercial vehicle, limousine (whether for hire or not for hire) or bus on any business street in the City.

(e) (1) [Reserved.] Residential and business streets – Limited neighborhood parking exception for commercial pickup trucks and vans weighing less than 8,000 pounds – When authorized – Special parking permit required. A commercial pick-up truck or van shall be allowed to park on a residential or business street if the commercial pick-up truck or van: (i) is lawfully parked at the curb in accordance with the general parking requirements of this Code; and (ii) bears a valid and current City wheel tax license emblem; and (iii) has a gross weight of less than 8,000 pounds, and (iv) bears a valid and current special parking permit issued, in accordance with paragraph (2) of this subsection (e), by the alderman of the ward in which the owner of the commercial pick-up truck or van resides, and (v) is parked on either side of the same block of the street where the owner of the commercial pick-up truck or van resides, regardless of whether such street is a residential or business street. Provided, however, that if

the vehicle owner's residence is located on a corner lot, such owner may park the commercial vehicle on either side of the block of any residential or business street that fronts or is across from any portion of such vehicle owner's residence.

Pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection (e), a special parking permit shall be required to park a commercial pick-up truck or van on a residential or business street. The person seeking a special parking permit under this subsection (e) shall submit an application for the permit to the alderman of the ward in which such person resides. The local alderman shall issue a special parking permit to such person if all of the following requirement are met: (1) the vehicle owner's legal primary residence is located in the alderman's ward; and (2) the commercial pick-up truck or van weighs less than 8,000 pounds; and (3) the vehicle bears a valid and current City wheel tax license emblem; and (4) the vehicle owner has no outstanding debt to the City for parking violations or has satisfied or otherwise resolved any such debt within the meaning of Section 2-32-094; and (5) the commercial pick-up truck or van is in apparent compliance with this section and other applicable requirements of this Code. Such special parking permit shall be: (i) valid for one year from the date of its issuance; and (ii) affixed by the vehicle's owner to the inside of the vehicle's front windshield directly above the city wheel tax license emblem.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take full force and effect upon its passage and publication.
