SUBSTITUTE ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Section 4-60-200 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by adding the language underscored, and by deleting the language struck through, as follows:

4-60-200 Violation - Penalty.

Any person found in violation of Section 4-60-130 by commencing the unauthorized sale of early Sunday liquor sales shall be fined not less than \$5,000.00 nor more than \$10,000.00 for each violation offense. Any person found in violation of Section 4-60-140(g) shall be fined not less than \$400.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 for each offense. Any person violating any other provisions of this chapter shall be fined not less than \$300.00 nor more than \$5,000.00 for each offense, except where otherwise specifically provided. A separate and distinct offense shall be held to have been committed each day any person continues to violate any of the provisions hereof of this chapter.

SECTION 2. Section 4-156-424 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by adding the language underscored as follows:

4-156-424 Outdoor patio.

At no time may any live or recorded music be played or performed on the outdoor premises of a public place of amusement licensed as an outdoor patio. This prohibition shall not apply to an outdoor patio operated in conjunction with a consumption on the premises — Incidental activity license issued under Chapter 4-60, at a museum located at the Field Museum of Natural History, the Shedd Aquarium, the Adler Planetarium or the Art Institute of Chicago. Any person found in violation of this section shall be fined not less than \$400.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 for each offense. Every day a violation occurs shall be a separate and distinct offense.

SECTION 3. Section 8-32-080 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by adding the language underscored, and by deleting the language struck through, as follows:

8-32-080 Regulated entertainment businesses.

(Omitted text is unaffected by this ordinance)

(c) Where a business has been found liable for two violations of this section, and has been charged with a third violation, all within a one-year period, the superintendent Superintendent of police Police may recommend to the mayor Mayor or the commissioner Commissioner of business affairs and consumer protection Business Affairs and Consumer Protection, and to the local liquor control commissioner Local Liquor Control Commissioner, if applicable, the suspension or revocation of the liquor license, the public place of amusement license, or both licenses. Such a recommendation shall be based on an evaluation of the severity of the violations, steps taken to remedy the violations, and the likelihood of successful remediation and continued compliance with this section.
