MISCELLANEOUS SIGNS

PARKING PROHIBITED DURING SPECIFIED HOURS - STREET CLOSURE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, Section 080, of the Municipal Code of Chicago, the operator of a vehicle shall not park such vehicle upon the following public way in the areas indicated During the Parking Prohibited Hours Specified - Street Closure:

WARD MISCELLENEOUS:

- 9 S. Prairie Avenue; S. Prairie Avenue from E. 101st Street to E. 102nd Street; Street Closure, 8:15am to 9:00am and 3:15 to 4:00pm, School Days -- (14-00736918) [02014-2458]
- 9 10536 S. Langley Avenue; S. Langley Avenue from E. 105th Street to E. 106th Street; Street Closure, Poe Elementary Classical School, 8:30am to 9:00am and 3:45pm to 4:00pm, School Days - (14-01678989) [Or2014-446]

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication. CHICAGO, MARCH 18, 2015
