BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, Section 160, of the Municipal Code of Chicago, the following locations are hereby designated as Loading Zones for the distances specified, during the hours specified:

- WARD                      LOADING ZONES / STANDING ZONES:
- 25                      311 West 23rd Street; 30 Minute Standing Zone, Distance of 30 Feet All Times, All Days, [02022-3957]
  - 25                      Repeal 15 Minute Standing Zone, 2139 to 2143 South California Avenue; 8:00am to 9:00pm, All Days [02023-1364]
  - 27                      1419 West Carroll Avenue 45 feet; Loading Zone, 7am-2am, All Days [02023-1425]

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.
