SPEED LIMITATIONS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to establish and/or amend Speed Limitations at the below listed locations:

WARD MISCELLEANEOUS:

31	West Roscoe Street from North Lockwood Avenue to North Cicero Avenue; Speed Limitation 20 Miles Per Hour Not Recommended; It is against City Policy to reduce the Speed Limit more than 5 Miles Per Hour. [02021-3002] 21-04363403"
31	North Kilbourn Avenue from West Belden Avenue to West Belmont Avenue; Speed Limitation 20 Miles Per Hour [02021-3003]
36	West Roscoe Street from North Narragansett Avenue to Linder Avenue; Speed Limitations 20 Miles Per Hour [02021-3139]
