### SPEED LIMITATION

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

**SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, Section 070 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to operate such vehicle at a greater speed than in indicated upon the streets or other public ways designated within the limits specified:**

#### WARD              SPEED LIMITATION:

- 1, 2, 32      North Milwaukee Avenue; North Milwaukee Avenue between West Division Street and North Western Avenue; Speed Limitations - 20 Miles Per Hour [02017-6829]
- 1 ,2, 32      North Milwaukee Avenue; North Milwaukee Avenue between West Division Street and North Western Avenue; Speed Limitations - 20 Miles Per Hour [02017-6832]

**SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication. CHICAGO, OCTOBER 11, 2017**
