SINGLE DIRECTION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, Section 010 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, the operator of a vehicle shall operate such vehicle only in the direction specified below on the public ways between the limits indicated:

WARD SINGLE DIRECTION:

41 4800-4899 N. Neva Avenue; N. Neva Avenue from W. Strong Street to W. Gunnison Street; Single Direction - Southerly - (14-00507875) [02013-9182]

WARD AMEND SINGLE DIRECTION:

14 W. 51st Street; Repeal Single Direction - Westerly, first alley parallel to and south of W. 51st Street between S. Sawyer Avenue and S. Spaulding Avenue, traffic to move in a (westbound) direction only, by striking the above [02014-4144]

27 900 W. Weed Street; Repeal Single Direction - Westerly, 900 W. Weed Street between N. Fremont Street and N. Kingsbury Street, all times, all days, by striking the above [02014-4134]

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage

To the President and Members of the City Council:
