#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

**SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to install and/or amend School Parking signs at the below listed locations:**

#### WARD MISCELLEANEOUS:

- 13            W. 61st Street; W. 61st Street (south side) from S. Normandy Avenue to S. Natoma Avenue; No Parking Tow Zone, except for Official School Personnel Permit Parking Only, 7:00am to 4:30pm, School Days - (14-00471228) [02014-1510]
- 47            N. Paulina Street; N. Paulina Street (west side) from a point 30 feet north of W. Cullom Avenue to a point 185 feet north thereof; No Parking Tow Zone, Except Authorized Ravenswood Elementary School Personnel, 7:00am to 4:30pm, Monday through Friday [02014-7995]

**SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.**
