Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to UPTOWN COVENANT CHURCH upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to maintain and use four (4) Sign(s) projecting over the public right-of-way attached to its premises known as 4612 N CLIFTON AVE.

Said Sign structure(s) measures as follows along W. Wilson Avenue:

One (1) at two point six seven (2.67) feet in length, five (5) feet in height and sixteen point six seven (16.67) feet above grade level.

One (1) at five point eight three (5.83) feet in length, zero point five six (0.56) feet in height and eleven point three nine (11.39) feet above grade level.

Said Sign structure(s) measures as follows along N. Clifton Avenue:

Or.e (1) at one point five (1.5) feet in length, two (2) feet in height and ten (10) feet above grade level.

One (1) at thirteen point four three (13.43) feet in length, one point one seven (1.17) feet in height and fourteen point four two (14.42) feet above grade level.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall bo constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Zoning Department - Signs.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #BACP 1540561 herein granted the sum of four hundred (\$400.00) per annum In advance. A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date. The permit holder agrees to hold the City of Chicago harmless for any damage, relocation or replacement costs associated with damage, relocation or removal of private property caused by the City performing work in the public way.
