BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to establish and/or amend One Hour Parking Restriction Signs at the below listed locations:

WARD MISCELLENEOUS:

- 33 4669 North Manor Avenue; Repeal Ordinance which reads: North Manor Avenue (east side) from a point 105 feet south of West Leland Avenue to a point 37 feet south thereof; One Hour Parking, 8:00am to 6:00pm, All Days, by Striking the above - (16-08071807) [02016-7763]
- 38 West Addison Street; West Addison Street (north and south side) from North Neva Avenue to the first alley east thereof; One Hour Parking, 9:00am to 6:00pm, Monday through Friday -- (16-08202924) [02016-8325]
