**SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to install 2 Hour Parking Restriction signs at the below listed locations:**

### WARD MISCELLENEOUS:

- 36            W. George Street; W. George Street (south side) from N. Harlem Avenue to the first alley east thereof; One Hour Parking, 8:00am to 8:00pm, Monday through Saturday - (14-01322168) [02014-5087]
- 40            5149 N. Ashland Avenue; N. Ashland Avenue from 50 feet south of W. Foster Avenue to the alley at the end of the building; One Hour Parking, 60 feet space, 7:00am to 7:00pm, Monday through Friday [02014-4045]

**SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication. CHICAGO, NOVMBER 5, 2014**
