



WHEREAS, the Administrator of the FAA, Michael Huerta, stated that a new system is at least two years away from introduction and may take a decade to be fully implemented; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for an immediate backup system to prevent similar disruptions, cancellations and economic harm in the future and causing millions of dollars in economic impact; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Committee on Aviation hereby requests the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration, or his delegate, and the Commissioner of the Chicago Department of Aviation to appear before the aforementioned Committee to testify regarding the situation in Aurora, IL and to divulge contingency plans to prevent future disruptions to air traffic at Midway and O'Hare airports.
