

community oriented policing programs, including COP House, to keep our communities safe and rebuild relationships with our residents; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. The Superintendent of the Chicago Police Department shall review and take all necessary actions, consistent with appropriate safety, security and community policing protocols, to approve a community policing pilot program commonly referred to as a "COP House" in the 5th Police District, subject to: (i) proposal by the sponsor of a budget for the pilot program for a two-year pilot; (ii) the identification of a funding source vetted by and acceptable to the Superintendent and the Budget Director; (iii) a funding stream as to amount and duration; and (iv) the passage of an ordinance appropriating and ensuring the continuity of such funds. Such pilot program shall include a remote CAPS office to help provide an anchor location of safety and stability to reduce violence in the Roseland community area, and shall be funded, in whole or in part, by private funding commitments and corporate sponsorships. Such program may also include provision of a range of other City services to the residents of the Roseland community area.

SECTION 2. This Order shall take effect following due passage and publication.
