ORDINANCE

ANN & ROBERT H. LURIE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF CHICAGO Acct. No.
5640- 12 Permit No. 1120255

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to ANN & ROBERT H. LURIE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL OF CHICAGO, upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to construct, install, maintain and use three (3) Awning(s) projecting over the public right-of-way adjacent to its premises known as 4711 N. Broadway.

Said Awning(s) at N. Broadway measure(s):

One (1) at seven point four two (7.42) feet in length, and one (1) foot in width for a total of seven point four two (7.42) square feet.

One (1) at eleven point two five (11.25) feet in length, and one (1) foot in width for a total of eleven point two five (11.25) square feet.

One (1) at fifteen point seven five (15.75) feet in length, and one (1) foot in width for a total of fifteen point seven five (15.75) square feet.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Zoning Department - Signs.

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1120255 herein granted the sum of one hundred fifty (\$150.00) per annum in advance.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.

The permit holder agrees to hold the City of Chicago harmless for any damage, relocation or replacement costs associated with damage, relocation or removal of private property caused by the City performing work in the public way.
