TRAFFIC LANE - TOW ZONES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, of the Municipal Code of Chicago, the following locations are hereby designated as Traffic Lane - Tow Zones, between the limits and during the times specified, standing or parking of any vehicle shall be considered a definite hazard to the normal movement of traffic:

| 3 | East Cermak Road (North and South) from South Wabash Avenue to South Michigan Avenue; No Parking Tow Zone, 10:00pm-6:00am, Thursday through Sunday [02021-4103] |
| 27 | South Loomis Street (west side) from West Monroe Street To a Point 200 feet North thereof; No Parking Tow Zone, All Times, All Days, South Loomis Street (east side) from West Monroe Street to West Madison Street; No Parking expect vehicles displaying OEMC Parking Permit Tow Zone All Times, All Days [02021-4998] |
| 47 | North Marshfield Street (west side) from West Cornelia Avenue to a point approximately 200 feet north of West Cornelia Avenue, approximately to the first alley north of West Cornelia Avenue; No Parking Tow Zone, 7:00am-4:30pm, School Days [02021-4823] Not Recommended |

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.
