ORDINANCE
OXFORD OBG HOTEL WACKER CHICAGO LLC Acct. No.
317381 -2 Permit No. 1110423

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to OXFORD OBG HOTEL WACKER CHICAGO LLC, upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to maintain and use, as now constructed, one (1) Grease Trap(s) under the public right-of-way adjacent to its premises known as 111 W. Huron St..

Said Grease Trap(s) at W Huron measure(s):
One (1) at nine (9) feet in length, and three (3) feet in width for a total of twenty-seven (27) square feet.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Transportation (Office of Underground Coordination) and Department of Water Management.

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1110423 herein granted the sum of four hundred (\$400.00) per annum in advance.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.
