SINGLE DIRECTION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, Section 010 of the Municipal

Code of Chicago, the operator of a vehicle shall operate such vehicle only in the direction specified below on the public ways between the limits indicated:

WARD AMEND SINGLE DIRECTION:

S. University Avenue; Amend ordinance passed 3/2/51, journal page 7972, by striking therefrom: S. University Avenue from Hyde Park Boulevard to E. 59th Street, Single Direction (northerly) and inserting in lieu thereof; S. University Avenue from Hyde

8 S. Stony Island Avenue; Amend Ordinance passed 9-16-1992, journal page 21073, which reads: E. 71st Place from Dorchester Avenue to S. Stony Island Avenue one way westbound by striking S. Stony Island Avenue and inserting in lieu thereof; first alley west of S.
